Kishōtenketsu

- Introduction (ki): introducing characters, era, and other important information for understanding the setting of the story.

 Development (shb): follows leads towards the twist in the story. Major changes do not occur.

 Twist (ten): the story turns toward an unexpected development. This is the crux of the story, the yama (ヤマ) or climax. In case of several turns in the
- narrative, this is the biggest one.

 Conclusion (ketsu), also called ochi (落ち) or ending, wraps up the story.

The kishōtenketsu form is used frequently in the anime movies of Hayao Miyazaki and his Studio Chibli


